You are on CCTV signs would be required. This should be proceeded with and try to disguise the cameras as much as possible, plus install dummy cameras that are visible. The compressor has died again, the suspicion is the head gasket or a valve. We will look at a new one and keep the pump to rebuild as a spare.
