Palliative care is an approach that improves the quality of life of patients and their families who are facing life-threatening illness which interferes with all areas of their lives. The disease itself and also its treatment can cause significant changes in the life of the patient and his/her family they may not be prepared for. At a time when the body is deteriorating significantly, the patient is becoming increasingly dependent on the help of others and patient starts to face the questions of the meaningfulness of life, his own passing, dying and death. The attitude towards oneself and the internal experience and understanding of oneself during illness affects the general well-being of each individual. The relationship between the patient, family and rest of social world can dramaticaly change. Patient can feal vulnerability, sadness, fear or face more serious problems such as anxiety, depression, panic, social and spiritual isolation. The boundaries of psychological, social and spiritual care are often blurred.

This unpleasant emotional, psychological, social and spiritual experience hinders the ability to cope not only with the disease itself but also with its treatment and deteriorates the quality of patient's life. The fragility of the patient, mental, social and spiritual distress are often unrecognised and disapproved.

This year's congress will address exactly these problems in the lives of patients in palliative care.
