26/10 Clerk's notes (need no approval)

1. Stream on Back Lane was re-reported to E Agency due to cloudy discharge 13.10.25
2. Flooding of Main Street opposite the VAS due to block gullies was reported to NYC 05.09.25 and re-reported 1.12.25
3. Lighting concerns at Queens Ethelburgas have been addressed to villagers' satisfaction by Ms. Martin. QE has also offered to pay towards adjusting and lowering the road level at the dangerous junction on the B6265. Ms. Martin has also asked the parents using the back road from TU to LO to be careful and reduce speed. The PC expresses its gratitude to QE for its support in these matters.
4. Subsidence and road cracking on Tippetts Lane was reported to NYC 1.12.25. This is now worse with gaping crevices of 150mm drop on one side. Low skirted cars have to go off road to avoid the cracks.
5. Request for improved fencing made to farmers regarding loose cows on Moss Hill Lane. REWRITE
6. Two open manhole covers, Lodge Corner/Moat Hall reported 18.12.25. Telecom cable was stolen.
7. Road erosion by gully cover, Moat Hall, reported to NYC 5.1.25
