As a rule of entrance, each Area 21 Riding Club who wishes to enter must supply: 1 Helper per Team. The job role will be allocated by CWMAMAN RC and posted along with the times. Please make sure your helpers are comfortable with the job role and are aware of dressage rules. These may include arena party work or stewarding.

Friday 10th 2019 please note that Preliminary entries must be made on the BRC Preliminary entire page online by Friday 3rd May 2019. Only full members who have been declared to BRC HQ by this date are eligible to compete.

ON THE DAY: Team Managers will be required to declare teams and individuals on arrival, and no later than 30 minutes before the start of the class, using the official Declaration Forms supplied by BRC HQ.

Each horse will be checked against the Flu Vaccination Certificate brought with the competitor. Any horse with a certificate found to be incorrect may be allowed to enter H.C. at the discretion of the Official Steward, but this counts as disqualification, so they may not be replaced in their team, either at the qualifier or at the finals, should the team qualify.

Hat and tack inspection will be In hand

- **This competition will run under BRC Rules.**
- **It is important that competitors are aware of rules relating to this competition – please see the current BRC Handbook.**
 - **All entrants must pay a prelim entry of £30 per team or £9.50 per individual to British Riding Clubs at least 21 days before the date of the qualifier. Online entries can be made via the BHS bookshop www.britishhorse.com. Late prelim entries may be accepted at the discretion of the organiser with a late surcharge of £20 per team and £10 per individual, if there are sufficient spaces. Late entries cannot be guaranteed therefore must not be paid for until approval from the organiser has been sought.**
 - **If the date of the qualifier is cancelled for any reason, the close of prelim entry will remain. However, if the qualifier is moved more than 21 days later, entries will be re-opened but**

late entry fees cannot be refunded. Eligibility will be approved at the original close of prelim entry.

- **All hats must have a visible current BRC hat tag in place before they are used for warming up and competing, to show that it meets the current safety standards. There will be a trained official available on the day to do this for you if your hat does not currently have one. You must have your hat checked before you ride. For up to date hat rules please see the current BRC Handbook.**

- **Your horse must have up to date influenza vaccinations in line with rule G7 in the current BRC Handbook. You will need to bring this on the day to be checked before you ride. There is also a checking device on the BRC website, but if you are unsure, please call BRC on 02476 840518.**
