HOLY FAMILY

On the Sunday after Christmas Day we celebrate the Holy Family of Jesus, Mary and Joseph. This family and household Jesus spent 30 of his 33 earthly years in Nazareth.

Some spiritual writers have called these the 'hidden years', because there is so little written about them in the Gospel narratives.

However, they reveal the holiness of ordinary life and show us how it becomes extraordinary for those baptised into Christ.

From the very earliest times of Christianity, the Christian family has rightly been called a domestic church. In our own Christian family we can learn the way of selfless love in the School of Nazareth. It is a school of prayer where we learn to listen, to meditate, to penetrate the deepest meaning of the Incarnation, of God-with-us.


Mary and Joseph are our examples on how we meditate on these mysteries.

We can learn the meaning and mystery of this beautiful Feast and apply it to our own family life - the path to holiness is found in living our ordinary family life with the Lord Jesus at the centre of it all.

Family is where progress in the Christian life, the way of ordinary holiness, can find its raw material. Whether we choose to respond to grace - and develop the eyes to see, ears to hear, and hearts to accept the hidden invitations to learn to love beneath the surface of that daily stuff - is all wrapped up in the mystery of human freedom. Our choices not only affect the world around us, they make us become the people we will become.





And there was a prophetess, Anna, the daughter of Phanuel, of the tribe of Asher. She was advanced in years, having lived with her husband seven years from when she was a virgin, and then as a widow until she was eightyfour. She did not depart from the temple, worshiping with fasting and prayer night and day. And coming up at that very hour she began to give thanks to God and to speak of him to all who were waiting for the redemption of Jerusalem.

And when they had performed everything according to the Law of the Lord, they returned into Galilee, to their own town of Nazareth. And the child grew and became strong, filled with wisdom. And the favour of God was upon him.
